





#### **Program Participants Analysis**

#### a. Hardcore Poor Family:

Those families who do not have capable income earners and no regular income sources, no productive assets like own agricultural lands or cattle for maintaining their day-to-day livelihoods. Poor women headed family, person with chronic sick and disability, helpless elderly people, more family members but few income earners will be considered as hardcore poor families.

#### b. Poor Family:

Those families who maintain their unsecured lives and livelihoods due to insufficient income source with deficit resources. They have take loan from others to meet up the family crises and losing their assets to repay the loan. In this process their lives becoming downwards to hardcore poor. The agriculture labors, hired rickshaw pullers, small traders (who lead the business by themselves without hiring labor) and poor fishermen (who are involved in fishing themselves), Potters are the examples of poor families.

#### c. Marginalized Families:

Those families who are able to maintain their families by their own income, having no surplus and cannot increase their assets at the end of the year. Small Farmers, Sharecroppers, Rickshaw pullers, fisherman, Carpenters, mansions, are the examples of Marginal Families.

#### d. Poor Ethnic Community and Underprivileged People:

Aboriginal and religious minorities (Hindus, Buddhist, Christian), lower cast (Cobbler, Berber, Washer Man & Women etc).

#### e. Small and Medium Entrepreneurs and Special Service Providers:

Small entrepreneurs, community producer groups, small business person who are involved in market management, special service providers and institutions are the examples of this stakeholder group.

#### f. Public Representatives of the Local Government and Social Institutions:

Representatives of Local Government institutions (Representatives of UPs, Upazila and Municipalities), Child and Students of selected Primary Schools and members of social institutions in working area who are directly receiving service from ASED Habigonj are the example of this stakeholder group. Members of CBOs, Civil society, Village Development Committee, Alliance for end domestic violence against women who are contributing project management, advocacy, campaign and local problems solving. Besides these; social elites, representatives of social institutions and who are receiving capacity building support directly from the Organization will be included under this criteria.

#### Management of the organization:

ASED Habigonj practices a democratic process of decisions making which is unique and different from many other development Organizations. The General Committee and Executive Committee of ASED hold the supreme authority in making decisions. ASED Habigonj adopts decentralized and participatory management system. The organization maintain the relation and accountability both horizontally and vertically; General Committee, Executive committee and Chief Executive.

#### **General Committee:**

The General Committee has been formed consisting of 33 members where 14 are female and 19 are male. The committee meets once a year. But if necessary it can summon emergency meeting. The member of the general committee has to take part in each meeting of general committee and different organizational work.

#### **Executive committee:**

The Executive Council is formed with 9 potential members who are selected or elected from general committee for a period of 3 years. The EC consisted of President-1, Vice-president-1, Chief Executive-1, Deputy Chief Executive -1, Treasurer-1 and 4 General Members. The chairman sits once in a quarter to find out the progress and problem of activities of the organization and take necessary decision for proper implementation. Chief Executive is the member secretary of the Executive committee.

#### **Chief Executive:**

The Chief Executive is appointed by the Executive Committee. He is the executive head of the organization. Chief Executive will implement all decision of the EC. He is responsible overall administration and program implementation. He is assisted by his subordinate staffs and responsible for keeping contact with government and non-government agencies and donors. The Executive Director is responsible to the executive committee.

#### Project 1: Promoting Science Education in Secondary Schools (PSE)

We are surrounded by technology and product of science in everyday life. It influence in every aspect of our lives. Science is one of the most important subjects in school due to its relevance of student lives. It is a life skill that allow student for critical thinking and problem solving. But unfortunately the ratios of science student in secondary school level in some part of Bangladesh are very much frustrating. From the experience and analyzing the context ASED Habigonj running a project with the support of Bangladesh Freedom Foundation (BFF).

This project works 31 secondary school including 4 Madrasha under two Upazila, Habigonj sadar and Shayetagonj in Habigonj district. A total 20236 student are benefited from this project where 9448 are girl's student. Last year 2021 September was the project closing year but due to the significant performance by ASED Habigonj, Bangladesh Freedom Foundation extended the project for next two year with some innovative new intervention.

During Coved pandemic period we face some difficulties/challenges but it gives us some new idea for operating program activities smoothly. Online learning, prepare video documentation on science project and dissemination, organize zoom meeting with science club members, formation of messenger group etc are remarkable.

#### An Idea Can Change an Institution

Pran RFL Public School is a famous educational institution established in 2015, Olipur industrial zone located in Shayestagonj Upazila of Habigonj District. From its inception the school had a science department. But despite of having a science branch, no extra science-based activities were performed in the school apart from prescribed curriculum. ASED Habigonj has been working to popularize the science education in secondary school science 2018 in collaboration with Bangladesh Freedom Foundation. Headmaster and some other teacher of Pran RFL Public School saw some initiatives, like formation of science club, school based science fair and quiz competition, inter school science fair, leadership training, teachers skill development training on science subject etc which was performed by ASED Habigonj. Pran RFL public school authority expresses their interest and submits a written application to include their school under PSE project. Now this school gaining reputation by participating various science based activities at the Upazila and District level.



#### Project 2: Climate Change Adaptive Agriculture Expansion Project in Haor Area'

Climate change adaptation and risk reduction is a burning need and crucial development issue in Haor region. This region has long been lagging behind mainstream of the national development, although the economic development of Bangladesh is moving steadily at a moderate pace. The future challenges in the context of climate change and variability are also a major concern for the sustainable development of the Sylhet region. In this connection ASED Habigonj implementing a projecton 'Climate Change Adaptive Agriculture Expansion Project in Haor Area' in association with Share the Planet and Bangladesh Rice Research Institute (BRRI), funded by Japan Fund for Global Environment (JFGE). This is three years project which start on 2020 April. The primary target beneficiaries in this project is 100 farmer in two villages, Sayedabad and Abdullahpur under Tegoria Union in Habigonj district beside this there are also secondary target beneficiaries under nine Upazila who will get benefit from this project.

Through this project ASED helping people adapt to existing change and prepare for future. We work closely with communities to develop simple, practical solution that can help to minimize the way for early flood and cold weave. During this period we have gained lots of success.

#### Major Activities and Achievement.

- Flood tolerance Amon Variety 71, 79, 87 and hybrid 4, 6 seed were distributed among 25 farmers to popularize Amon crop and multi use of land.
- Crop diversification is a major issue to address climate change vulnerability. In this regards Robi crop
  were introduce to regain its lost practice. ASED provided some skill and seed support to motivated
  farmer. Out of 100 farmer 49 farmer were produce Robi crop.

"According to the project plan, 800 feet cannel will be excavated and a road will be constructed during the project period. Total work will be completed into three phases. In May 2022 rest 800 feet was completed. Road are used for collecting paddy and fish from Ghungiajuri Haor and cannel used for irrigation. In dry season about 700/800 people moved everyday for their agricultural activities. This is a major and important activity of Climate Change Adaptive Agriculture Extension Project in Haor Area.

"ASED organized training on seed cultivation, harvesting and preservation of new varieties of rice. Out of 100 farmer 20 farmer were selected those who are interested and have the ability and opportunity to produce seed. As a result 90% of the 20 farmers produced and store seed.

"Soils naturally contain many nutrients like nitrogen, phosphorous, calcium, and potassium. These nutrients help plants to grow. When soil nutrients are missing or in short supply, plants suffer from nutrient deficiency and stop growing. To motivate the farmer and grow more production ASED distributed various types of fertilizer among 100 farmers.

"One of the aims of this project is to introduction of new varieties of rice to reduce the risk of flash floods and cold waves. These new varieties supposed to introduce in other areas. It was an advocacy initiative. In Habigonj there are 9 Upazila. Through these initiatives ASED organized 8 briefing session. A total 350 participants from different sector like Government Agricultural officer, public representative, media personal and farmer attended those sessions. After each briefing session a farmer list was made for Boro seed distribution.

Project 3: Strengthening Democracy By Promoting Human Rights Culture In Bangladesh

Legal aid support is essentially a mechanism that enables the poor and the vulnerable sector of the society. It enforces the legal rights in order to access a fair and equitable justice in the society. At present legal aid support is a burning need to ensure social and legal justice. Most of the citizen of Bangladesh is illiterate and they live below poverty line which incidentally makes matters worse. Due to their financial crisis and lack of legal knowledge they are often barred to access justice. Considering the critical and inhumane situation ASED Habigonj implementing Strengthening Democracy by Promoting Human Rights Culture in Bangladesh with the support from Ain o Salish Kendra (ASK).

#### The Following Activities were performed in this reporting period.

- 10 vulnerable women have got legal aid support to fight against injustice.
- Organize two Salish by which one woman back to her family and living with peaceful life. Other woman got 1, 05,000 taka as Denmohor. (Denmohor is a payment to the bride)
- Eight case concluded by court. A total 17,64,000 taka will be distributed among the client. This money will be paid by installment step by step as per court order.
- Information collected on ten Human Rights Violation (HRV) issues. These issue disseminated through
  print, electronic media and other popular way. It creates awareness and put pressure to the law
  enforcing authority and administration, which helps to reduce human rights violation.
- Organized meeting with panel Lawyer with regular basis. It helps for the better coordination and accelerates the legal aid support properly.
- Organize 28 courtyard meeting for creating awareness on all forms of violence against women and girls, law and legal issues.
- Provided consultancy service for the client to pay attention of their rights and legal issues. A total 130 woman have got this consultancy service

#### **Results: Highlights**

- Domestic violence has decreased somewhat.
- It is possible to solve family problem at low cost through arbitration.
- Human rights situation has improved in the area
- Legal assistance and human rights activities have been appreciated in all areas including administration.

#### Struggle and Hope of Khadija

Women are still oppressed, neglected and deprived of their rights in today's society. Khidija Akhtar is one of those abused and helpless women. She got love affair with Farhad. Ignoring her family decision, they got married each other. But Khadija has to face difficult reality at her husband's house. In the new family, she has to face harshness with her mother-in-law and father-in-law. She was insulted everyday for not bringing furniture, household item and cash at the time of marriage. Although Khadija's family initially refused to marry but due to her daughters happiness Khadija's father gave 50,000 tk for clothes and household items and 70,000 tk cash to buy furniture. Day by day the demand of Farhad's family is increasing. Khadija had to endure such torture silently thinking her future life.



Farhad was an unemployed youth so his father keep him pressure to bring 2,00,000 tk of Khadija's family to buy a CNG. By this time Khadija got pregnant. Khadija's husband Farhad Mia demanded 2,00,000 tk repeatedly. At one stage Farhad applied physical and mental torture for the dowry money and returned to ancestral home. By this time Khadija give birth a daughter baby. Khadijas physical condition started deteriorating due to various tensions. When the matter was bought to the notice of Farhad and his family, Farhad inform that it was not possible to take Khadija and her child without paying the dowry of 2,00,000 tk. The new born baby died just in ten days.

Shyamla Akhtar of the same village who has received legal aid support through ASED Habigonj with the help of Ain Salish Kendra. Through her advice, Khadija become aware of ASED's legal aid activities and expressed interest in seeking legal assistance in this regards. A case was filed under section 3 of the Dowry Prohibition Act on 31-10-2019. The case was transferred to the CGM branch and 1.50,000 tk was recovered through "Government Legal Aid. She purchased a paddy land and opened a deposit pension skim of that money. Now she is leading a happy life.

#### Project 4 Hope Of People.

The majority of the population of Bangladesh lives in rural area and their standard of living in terms of protection and safety is very low. Numerous natural disasters occur here very frequently. It affects the overall livelihood. To ensure the minimum standard of living condition to secure lives from hazard and reducing disaster risk ASED Habigonj initiated a housing project with the financial assistance of SELAVIB. Through this project 55 safe and durable dwelling semi pakka house will be build in Habigonj Sadar Upazila under Teghoria Union, Tongirghat village. A total 330 family member will be benefited under this project. Each house will be constructed 11'-6"x10'-6" one living room, 5'-0"x3'-9" one toilet and 3'-3" wide one veranda. This project starts on March 2022 and will be ended 15 September.

Project 5. Financial Support Program: An Innovative Business Model

In Bangladesh, there are many financial institute / NGO doing business. It is a fact that Bangladesh is the birth place of microfinance banking with credit to the Noble Peace Prize winner Muhammad Yunus. He invented a Microcredit model for poor and distressed people. Many NGO follow this model. Now a day this model is very traditional. ASED Hobigonj conducted a series of workshop, consultation, FGD with diverse group of people for getting the idea and assess the needs/demand of people. Through this process ASED Hobigonj realize the needs for people and innovate this Financial Support Program Model (FSP).

Actually it is not a credit program. It is a financial support program by which three parties will get benefit from here. One client second Diller or seller and third NGO or business provider.

The main philosophy of Financial support Program is service and profit but not only business and profit gaining. Financial Support Program strategy is not very traditional. It is a unique service oriented business. We match it within our capacity. We expand it slowly and gradually for its sustainability.

Before investing or provide financial support we make sure customer/client's need, capacity, and his business opportunity and then we provide financial support. We always made our Business plan with a participatory process.

Over the year, ASED's Financial Support Programme has been played a positive role in enhancing socioeconomic development of poor people by creating employment opportunities. ASED has persistently providing demand driven services to its recipients and bringing diversity in its FSP products.

#### Back from the end of the line

I am Asma. I got married three years ago but my husband is a drug user. I felt very lonely and depressed for drug use of my husband. As his craving for drugs gradually grew, so did violence at home. He would beat me. During the time the trauma and discrimination that we faced more painful than the beatings and effects of drug use. Every now and then, hestarted demanding dowry from my father. But poor father could not able to fulfill his demand. After some days, he started metal and physical harassment. I was trying to keep my patience to save our family and continue conjugal life with my husband. But day by day his demand growing up. At last my husband send a divorce letter to me.

Suddenly I come to know ASED Habigonj running a Legal Aid Support program which is funded by Aino Shalish Kendra (ASK). Many other women like me also come in this office for getting legal Aid Support. The underprivileged women and children have the access on legal assistance by registering their complaints at the legal aid clinics. There is a Law Years Panel consisting six law year providing this legal support. One Legal Aid worker from ASED come to me and also my husband's house. She talked merit and demerit of divorce and court case. At last they realize the problem and mitigate their case.

Now I feel very good when I come here, my loneliness decrease. I can share my problems with other people and I became aware about my rights which I didn't know before. Now I know and try to deliver these messages to my neighbors, friends and well-wishers.

This is not the end of this story. There is another remarkable history behind it. ASED Provided an Easy Byke for creating an employment of my husband with very low service charge 8.75%. The rout was Tungirghat village to Kibriabridge. As a result, It changedour life. From a poor, now I became the owner of two Easy Bike. Our economic condition has been changed.

Realizing this ASED Habigonj incorporate this program for youth to create employment opportunity. This is the another history of Financial Support Program of ASED Habigonj.
